Note from The Headteachers

Welcome to the Ramsey Voice, which comes at the end of a year that we could not have predicted. We can definitely say it has been a year like no other and we must hope that next year provides us with the opportunity to return to a more 'normal' way of life. The Ramsey Voice is a celebration of the achievements of the students. Whilst many of the extra-curricular activities, trips and visits have had to be put on hold for the time being, we still have much to celebrate.



The Year 11 Leavers attended their 'live virtual' Awards Evening. Despite not being able to see everyone in person, the awards were presented and in this most difficult of years, where so many of the normal 'leaving' activities were cancelled, it was fantastic to celebrate their achievements.

In this edition we would also like to celebrate the staff: particularly their contribution to supporting students and their families during the year. The messages of thanks parents have sent to the whole staff or specific individuals have been greatly appreciated. Recognition of the provision to support Young Carers, the continuous work of the Pastoral Team and the collective efforts to raise donations for the food bank are just a few of the examples of how our staff always put the best interests of the children at the centre of everything we do.

This edition also contains information of how families and individuals can access additional support during the holiday period.

At times, we know not everyone has agreed with the decisions we have made, but we are attempting to ensure all members of our community stay safe, as we deliver the best possible educational experience.

We hope to gradually reintroduce many of the activities that are such an important part of the overall school experience, those that contribute to developing a broader understanding of the world in which we live. This will be done when it is safe and in line with government guidance.

A key factor in our decision making is allowing opportunities to be created to engage and excite which allow the students to become curious. Staff have been creative in their use of online technology. Parents have told us the students have had positive experiences when they have taken part in the lessons delivered via remote learning. Apart from a few technical issues, the online Parent-Teacher Consultations have also been well received by the majority of parents.

No doubt next year will be just as challenging as 2020, but in different ways. The promise of several new Covid-19 vaccines will take time to take effect. During that time, we will still have to implement the control measures in school and ask for your continued support.



Young Carers Award

Whether supporting a family member either emotionally or physically, Young Carers are amazing. Which can sometimes be under very difficult circumstances. We feel at The Ramsey Academy, that Young Carers should be supported both in and out of school to help them reach their full potential. This is why we applied to take part in the award scheme. We felt that this reinforces our belief that all staff should be involved in the support of these young people.



The award is built on 5 standards devised from feedback from young carers

1. UNDERSTAND — There are assigned members of staff with responsibility for understanding and addressing young carers needs
2. INFORM — Awareness is raised by sharing knowledge about disability, illness and young carers throughout the school
3. IDENTIFY — Young carers are being identified within your school
4. LISTEN — They are listened to, consulted with and given time and space to talk
5. SUPPORT — Young carers are supported within the school, and signposted to whole family resources and services outside the school. To gain an award, we ask schools to evidence how they are meeting these five standard






Remembrance Day 2020

On the 11th November 2020 the Ramsey Academy observed silence to honour the fallen soldiers that bravely gave the ultimate sacrifice for their country.






Geography Competition






Duke of Edinburgh Awards



We have been promoting our non-fiction books for Non-Fiction November!




