

Prefect Selection Criteria



Prefects play a vital role in setting a positive example and leading our student body. In order to be awarded prefect status, pupils must achieve a minimum set of standards. These are outlined below.



Criteria for Prefect Status:

Attendance: Pupils must have achieved over 95% attendance in Year 10. (Only in exceptional circumstances, where the school has been given an official medical diagnosis from a GP or a consultant will a lower attendance rate be considered. In these cases, attendance in Years 9, 8 & 7 will be considered)

- **Punctuality:** Be on time for registration and all lessons. More than five lates in Year 10 may affect your eligibility.
- **Behaviour:** Maintain excellent behaviour in school and during lessons, as reflected in your report grades and school record.
- **Effort:** Show outstanding effort in all lessons and homework. Low effort grades in any Year 10 subject may impact your selection.



- **Overall Demeanour:** Ramsey prefects are expected to be positive, enthusiastic and good role models for the younger pupils. Pupils must have displayed these positive qualities around school and in lessons throughout Year 10. Pupils must have had excellent uniform throughout Year 10 (there should be no occasions where rolling the skirt, trainers, make-up, earrings or any other uniform concerns have had to be dealt with). They will also have adhered to the no-phone policy.

For any pupil wishing to apply for prefect status,

- **1. Pick up an application booklet.**
- **2. Complete the form, detailing your academic achievements, extracurriculars and a personal statement:**
 - **a. Why you want the role**
 - **b. What you'd like to achieve**
 - **c. How you'll inspire others**
- **3. Secure a teacher reference: Choose a teacher who knows you well, and supply a brief summary of your contributions.**
- **4. Submit everything.**
