



Changes to sets and targets


While the data is generally accurate we know it is very important to know your children.



Summer Reading


Reading is a key skill your child will need whilst at Ramsey and in later life.

Over the summer we would like our new Year 7's to enjoy reading a book. We will be providing all students with a copy of the book, a bookmark and a reading challenge booklet.


The book is semi-autobiographical and follows the story of a Jewish child and her parents escaping Berlin to England during the 1930's.

In September pupils will be reviewing the book and discussing it in their English lessons at Ramsey.

The reading challenge booklet provides optional challenges for pupils who wish to earn some rewards and show their creative flair over the summer.



Supporting Reading



During the Summer you can support your child with their reading of the book in many ways.

- Remind them that they have it and encourage them to read it regularly
- Discuss what is happening in the book, ask your child what has happened and who the main characters are
- If they are struggling consider using an audio version of the book, listen together and summarise what has happened
- Discuss the meaning of any words they are unfamiliar with
- Remind them to keep the book in the folder and to return it in September

Additional Funding

Are you eligible for Pupil Premium funding?

•All children who currently qualify for <u>free school meals</u> based on their family circumstances are entitled to pupil premium. This applies if you receive any of the following benefits:

•Universal credit (provided you have a net income of £7400 or less)

Income support

•Income-based jobseekers' allowance

Income-related employment and support allowance

•Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999

•The guaranteed element of state pension credit

•Child tax credit, provided that you are not also entitled to working tax credit and have an annual gross income of £16,190 or less

•Children who are or have been in care, and children who have a parent who is or was in the armed forces, are also entitled to pupil premium.

In addition, pupils who have qualified for free school meals on the above grounds in the past, but are no longer eligible, continue to receive pupil premium for the next six years. Aspiration, Diversity, Endeavou
