## Why study Dance?

Dance is a powerful and expressive subject which encourages students to develop their creative, physical, emotional and intellectual capacity, whatever their previous experience in the subject. BTEC Performing Arts is for anyone with an interest in dance and performance. You don't need lots of previous experience – just passion and enthusiasm! This specification recognises the role of dance in young people's lives and students will study a range of dance styles and professional performances. They have an opportunity to choreograph their own final performance in any chosen style, providing it meets the assessment criteria. The study of professional works will develop their ability to critically appraise professional dance and provide a springboard for engaging in practical tasks.

## **Course Outline**

#### **Component 1: Exploring the Performing Arts**

Learners will develop their understanding of the performing arts by examining practitioners' work and the processes used to create performance.

#### **Component 2: Developing Skills and Techniques in the Performing Arts**

Learners will develop their performing skills and techniques through the reproduction of dance repertoire.

#### **Component 3: Responding to a Brief**

Learners will give the opportunity to work as part of a group to create a workshop performance in response to a given brief or stimulus.
