

High Quality Teaching & Learning

Our core purpose is to ensure that the quality of teaching and learning at the Academy is high and that our students are successful.

The **'Ramsey 10'** is our vision for effective teaching and learning. It contains the key parts that, we believe, ensure good and outstanding learning. From providing students with a clear understanding of what they are learning and what they are expected to achieve, to celebrating success and developing independence, the **'Ramsey 10'** underpins our work.

Fulfilling Potential

At The Ramsey Academy, students engage in a high quality curriculum. In Years 7 to 9 students have the opportunity to develop a variety of skills and knowledge through a wide range of academic and practical subjects.

In Year 10, students are guided into appropriate option GCSEs from a wide selection which complement the core GCSE subjects of English, Maths, Science and Triple Science option. Our curriculum is supported by various activities in which personal learning and thinking skills are highlighted in cross phase projects aimed to develop students' independent, creative, reflective and collaborative learning.

We actively encourage students to extend their learning beyond the classroom through a wide range of trips, visits and extra-curricular activities, both in this country and abroad. Students work towards completion of the Ramsey Achievement Award, which recognises academic progress, high levels of attendance and participation in a wide range of activities that develop life skills.


High Expectations
