Year 7: During Primary school students will have received varying amounts and experiences of Art. The initial baseline art assessment for Year 7 will be postponed for students to spend the first 2 or 3 lessons recapping aspects of the visual elements of art and how to respond and analyse artists work successfully. This will be taught through a mixture of theory and practical lessons. Knowledge, skills and understanding will be monitored using the art baseline assessment at a later stage.
