Year 9 Art Autumn Term Summary Grid

Learning Aim: Students recap drawing from real life and from sources. They develop and refine their use of mark making to create different tones and textures when creating realistic drawings. Students learn how to meet and cover the GCSE assessment objectives, they develop a better understanding of what skills are required to meet GCSE grades. Students learn to analyse and respond to an artists work in more depth and detail.

Year 9: Students in year 8 did not have a chance to complete a Claymation / animation project. This project has proved to be highly engaging for students, so our aim is to deliver aspects of it in the first half term and within the usual year 9 'Surfaces' project. The year 9 Scheme of work will be adapted so students can bring natural surfaces to life using a range of drawing materials and where possible some digital/sculptural/ceramics outcomes produced. Following this small unit of work students will continue with the reflective surfaces project of year 9. Low stakes testing will be used to monitor and assess the work on form, media techniques and surfaces. The GCSE criteria for assessment will also be used.
